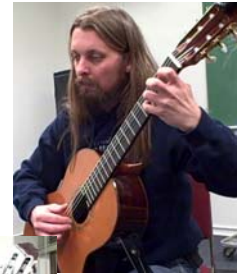
## FEBRUARY BUSINESS MEETING

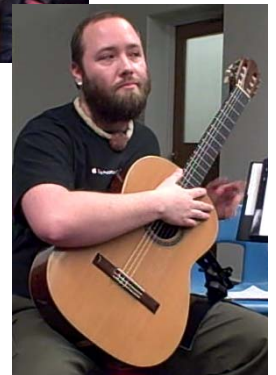
Ken Thompson began the business meeting with a report on upcoming concerts
